I said, Mr. Curry, you call me by my last name so I can call you what I want. Again, Mr. Curry fell into laughter and said, Hicks, I can't do nothing with you. Some of the staff at WCHS, heard what I had nicknamed Mr. Curry and often referred to him as such. Mr Curry was a quiet, humble man with a positive trait who had a shyness about him so I purposely went by to get a laugh or smile out of him. Mr. Curry would see me coming down the hall and would start smiling and just shake his head. He knew I was going to stop by to pick with him before going to my class.

This is a divine legacy of the walk Mr. Curry had and the impact of his footprints will live on in all the students he taught and coached. Mr. Curry's presence will truly be missed!! My thoughts are with his family during this difficult time.

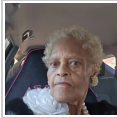
