“ Thoughts on the transition of my "Sister of the Heart"

Olivia, I thank God for putting you and Exter in our lives in 1969 when Rick and I moved to Durham. You were our first friends in Durham. We shared many, many happy times together. Even after the death of our spouses, we remained steadfast friends. You called us "Sister Friends" and I called you my "Sister of the Heart" and my "Sister in Love". Over a year ago when you were so sick in Duke Hospital and the outcome was looking grim, I prayed to God and asked Him not to take you then because I was not ready to deal with not having you in my life. He answered my prayer and gave us about a year and a half more together. I rejoiced and thanked God as your strength increased and you were able to walk again. On Jan 2nd you sent me a text asking that I pray with and for you that you would be discharged by the end of the month...that you had someone to provide home health services for you. I responded that I prayed for you everyday and that I was trusting God to continue to increase your strength so you could go home. I reassured you that God answers prayer. You replied " Thank you very much. I know God answers prayers. I know He hasn't brought me this far to leave me now. To Him be all the glory and honor". "Love you girl"! On Sunday I texted you to share that I had testified to my Church about you and what God was doing in your life. You texted me back to say that you had not been able to locate the service on You Tube, but you would keep trying. That was the last I heard from you. While we were getting excited and hopeful that you would be able to return home to Peppercorn St., little did we know that God was preparing you to move to a greater home. A home where there is no more sickness or death, because Jesus already "died once for all of us". Well, I am the only one left of our "foursome". Tell Rick and Exter "hello" and to "behave". Friendships built on mutual love, caring, honesty and respect are special. Please know that I will always love and remember you, my Sister. I praise and thank God for the times we spent together. While I will miss you terribly, I am comforted by the thought that you are safe in the arms of our Heavenly Father. He didn't leave you after all, He took you with Him. Until we meet again...I love you girl!!!
